5. SELECT GRANT PROPOSALS FOR FUNDING RECOMMENDATION: Commissioners discussed funding options and chose to fully fund the top scoring proposals and partially fund the lowest scoring proposal. After submitting individual scores, the average score for each proposal was determined and used to rank the proposals. Using that ranking, funding was recommended as follows:

6. CONTINUE DISCUSSION ON THE COUNTY <u>STRATEGIC PLAN 2032</u>: Commissioners reviewed the "Results Statement" for the Focus Area of "Environment, Climate, and Sustainability" and will propose the following statement:

"Ecosystems and watersheds are restored and protected to support biodiversity, climate resiliency, equitable public health and outdoor recreation, and overall environmental quality."

In addition, commissioners will suggest the following metrics for measuring success; water quality (Ex. Region 3 "Basin Plan"), water quantity, acreage of land that is sustainably managed as either open space or working lands, metrics described in existing Species Recovery Plans.

Finally, the commissioners voted to create a sub-committee, consisting of Commissioners Berry, Brown, Butler, and Alter, to continue discussion on this topic, as needed.
